LETTER OF SUPPORT FROM AMAH MUTSUN TO OPPOSE MINING OF SACRED LANDS AT JURISTAC, SANTA CLARA COUNTY

I am writing this letter in support and solidarity for the Amah Mutsun peoples in opposition to the proposal by your Board to permit mining of their sacred lands at Juristac for sand and gravel.

I am familiar with the history of the colonisation and brutal treatment of the Amah Mutsun over the past several hundred years. The fact that these injustices have not been addressed or redressed is a scar on the conscience of the USA and the State of California. If the Board of Supervisors of Santa Clara County is to now permit the despoliation and destruction of the sacred lands of the Amah Mutsun, is adding to the already incalculable injustices that has already been done to these brave peoples over a long period of US history.

Sadly, their history mirrors the treatment that was meted out to my own Moriori peoples here on Rekohu (Chatham Islands), New Zealand, so my people can relate strongly to the struggles that they face. We to have faced genocide and enslavement and near extinction.
